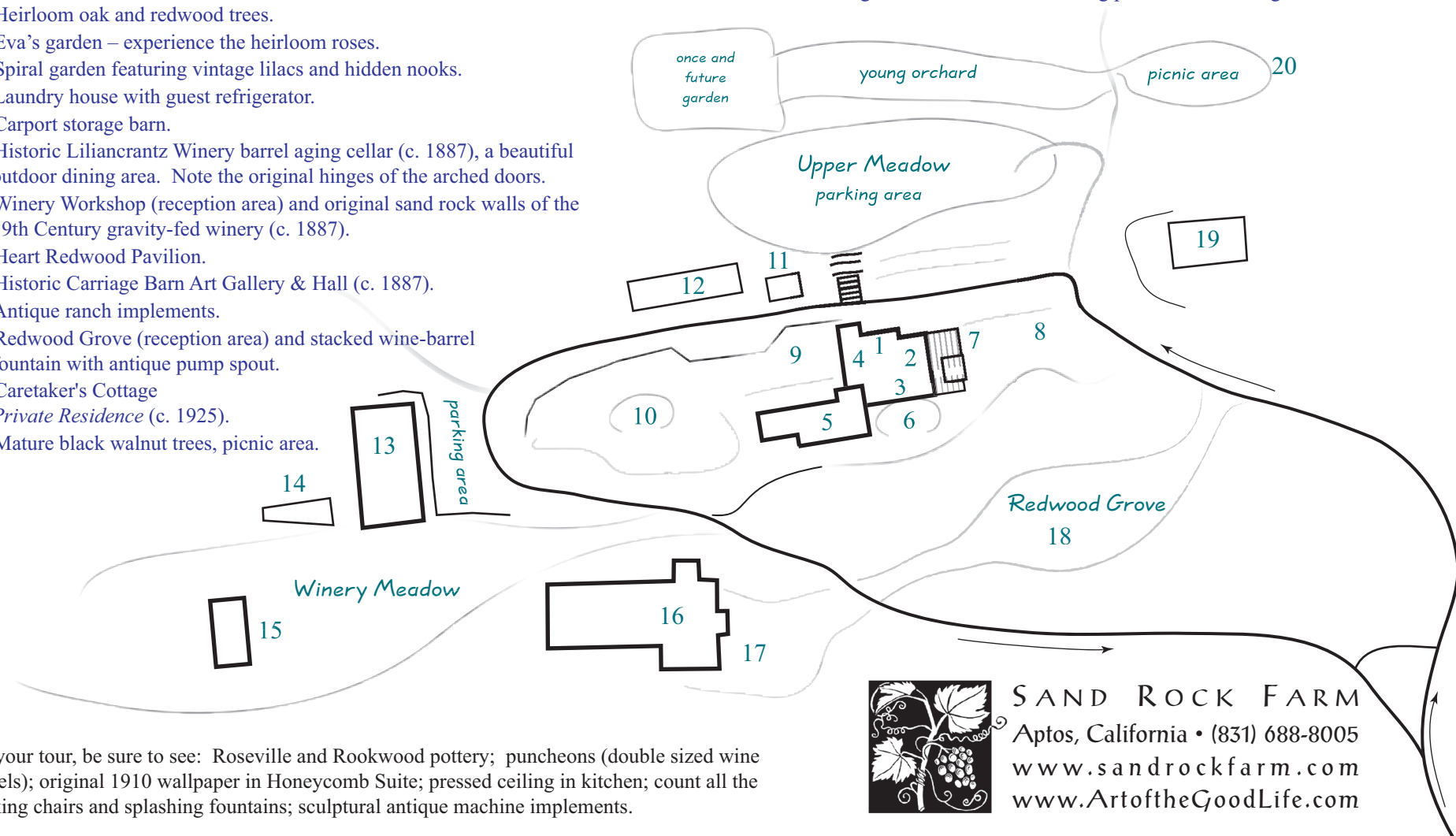


HISTORIC SAND ROCK FARM was originally a 1000-acre ranch and winery built by Dr. August and Eva Liliencrantz in the 1880's. Over 70 acres of vines were planted, and in 1907 they shipped 130,000 gallons of wine. Crops in the area were difficult at the turn of the century and prohibition was coming, so August and Eva's son, Henry Tod, moved into cattle ranching. Daughter Edith Liliencrantz was married in the house, descending the main stairs upon rose petals strewn by her young nephew Eric. Sand Rock Farm was written about in glowing terms at the turn of the last Century; we strive to recreate that experience for you on this historic 10 acres of garden and woodland.

1. Main house (c. 1910). Dining room – curly redwood mantle is a rare example of the woodwork of the Arts and Crafts era.
2. Original coffered redwood box beam ceiling is typical Craftsman. The stained glass in the livingroom was carried from England. The Eastlake Style parlor mirror was an original furnishing of the Claus Spreckels mansion (c. 1870).
3. Note the curly redwood entry door, with beveled glass and original brass hardware. The acanthus leaf sconce in the front hallway is an unusual original light fixture.
4. The late 1930s six burner, double oven, working Wedgewood stove is the centerpiece of the kitchen – a graceful marriage of form and function.
5. Original cottage (c. 1887) was constructed of heart redwood milled on site. Note the chamfered square columns on porch. The sun porch was enclosed around 1910 when the main house was built.
6. Tiered fountain garden – a hummingbird favorite! Note view to redwood grove.
7. Redwood dining deck overlooks the winding paths of the shade garden.

8. Heirloom oak and redwood trees.
9. Eva's garden – experience the heirloom roses.
10. Spiral garden featuring vintage lilacs and hidden nooks.
11. Laundry house with guest refrigerator.
12. Carport storage barn.
13. Historic Liliencrantz Winery barrel aging cellar (c. 1887), a beautiful outdoor dining area. Note the original hinges of the arched doors.
14. Winery Workshop (reception area) and original sand rock walls of the 19th Century gravity-fed winery (c. 1887).
15. Heart Redwood Pavilion.
16. Historic Carriage Barn Art Gallery & Hall (c. 1887).
17. Antique ranch implements.
18. Redwood Grove (reception area) and stacked wine-barrel fountain with antique pump spout.
19. Caretaker's Cottage
20. Mature black walnut trees, picnic area.



On your tour, be sure to see: Roseville and Rookwood pottery; puncheons (double sized wine barrels); original 1910 wallpaper in Honeycomb Suite; pressed ceiling in kitchen; count all the rocking chairs and splashing fountains; sculptural antique machine implements.
